Each student must **successfully complete credit-bearing courses/experiences to cover all of the K-State 8 areas.** Some of the K-State 8 areas may be covered in the student's major. The intent of the K-State 8 is for students to explore the perspectives of disciplines that may be quite different from those of their own majors. For that reason, **a minimum of four different course prefixes (e.g., AGEC, MATH, FSHS) must be represented** in the fulfillment of the K-State 8 requirements. ****K-State 8/General Education Requirements
for Transfer Students**

Transfer students are required to cover all eight of the K-State 8 areas. When Kansas State University has an articulation agreement with a transfer institution, we will rely on that agreement to determine which K-State 8 area(s) transfer credit(s) could cover. For example, when a K-State course is tagged for one or two areas, then the “equivalent” course from another institution will be tagged for the same one or two areas. The student's dean's office will determine -- on a case by case basis -- which K-State 8 area(s) can be allocated to a non-equivalent transfer course.
