General Information

Teams of four can compete; the top three scores will count for the team total. Each of the three CDE sections will account for 1/3 of each contestant's final score.

All scoring will be done with the national contest score sheets and graded by computer. This contest will be scored with JudgingCard.com. To accommodate the available scorecard formats, we reserve the ability to alter the number of questions in each section.

Official FFA dress is not required for the Nursery and Landscape CDE.

What to bring:

- A clean clipboard
- At least two No. 2 pencils
- A calculator—calculators used in this event should be battery-operated, nonprogrammable, and silent with large keys and large displays. Calculators may have only these functions: addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, equals, percent, square root, +/- key, and one memory register. No other calculators can be used during the event.
- Additional items allowed but not required include the following:
 - An architect's scale
 - An engineer's scale

What NOT to bring:

- Cell phones will not be permitted.

People permitted in contest spaces:

- Contestants
- KSU staff and volunteers assisting with the contest

No other people will be allowed to enter contest spaces at any time during the contest. If items needed for the contest are left behind, adults are not permitted to bring them to their students.

Contest sections and point values

A. General Knowledge Written Examination - (100 points) 30 minutes

- 50 multiple-choice questions over general knowledge of the horticulture industry, nursery production practices, landscape design, and maintenance

B. Plant Identification - (100 points) 30 minutes

- 50 specimens will be selected from the nursery/landscape plant list. *See attached list.*

C. Comprehensive Practicum - (100 points total) 30 minutes.

- 50 stations will include questions, materials, or examples from all three practicum areas. Individual Practicum Areas are described below:

1. Equipment and Supplies Identification

- Includes identification of tools, containers, and growing mix materials
- *See Attached:* “Nursery/Landscape Equipment and Supplies Practicum Identification List”
- Students will be given the “Nursery/Landscape Equipment and Supplies Practicum Identification List” for the event.

2. Pests, Disorders, and Beneficial Insect Identification

- Includes problems associated with insects, diseases, or environmental factors, as well as beneficial insects
- *See Attached:* “Nursery/Landscape Pests, Disorders, and Beneficial Insects Practicum Identification List.” The list will be printed on a double-sided piece of paper: one side alphabetical by scientific name, and the other alphabetical by common name.
- Students will be given the “Nursery/Landscape Pests, Disorders, and Beneficial Insects Practicum Identification List” for the event.

3. Landscape Drawing

- Evaluation or interpretation of landscape design(s)
